

Improving Attendance from Both Sides

SBHC Helps Students, Their Attendance Improves

We look at who is missing school, and ask what supports they need.

After receiving school-based mental health and counseling, SBHC users had...

- 50% decrease in absentee-ism and
- 25% decrease in tardiness 2 months

Medical services helped decrease absences by 50% among students who had three or more absences in a sixweek period.

Students who received **mental health** services had an 85% decline in school discipline referrals.

A study by Johns Hopkins University found that school-based health centers reduced inappropriate emergency room use among regular users of school-based health centers.
